105th Church Anniversary

The first Services were held on Sunday, 14 July, 1912, at Pinewood Hall, Fleet.

The Foundation Stones of our current building were laid on Thursday, 30 April, 1914, but it was not until 15 July, 1914 that the Church was officially opened for worship.

On Sunday, 19 July, 1914, at 11 am and 6.30 pm the first Services were held in the present Church building.

The Minister of the Church Rev. W. Ellis Holt conducted both Services.
