### FROM THE MANSE

*Dear Friends*

As I write this pastoral letter, young people are in the swing of a new school year. It can be a time of anxiety and hope for future dreams to come to fruition; yet for some children—and indeed, adults—it is tinged with judgement. Why? Because we as a society strive for perfection, believing that only the best is ever good enough.

A couple of years ago there was a television documentary about a school in Yorkshire, where pupils were being taught in new ways to enable learning to develop. Learning and opportunity do not just happen at school; they happen throughout our life, for we are all **lifetime learners**.



- Look at **Moses**: in his ripe old age, God used him to move a nation;
- Look at **Abraham**: God used him to start a family;
- Look at **Deborah**: God called her to become the first female Judge;
- Look at **Paul**: God moved his understanding from that of a strict Jewish mind-set to becoming a traveller who met people where they were and spoke about the Love and Good News of Jesus Christ.

As Christians we have a different measurement for success. The Scripture tells us that there were no exams, only memory:

- Remember your Creator;
- Remember your family, and where you have come from;
- Remember your personal life story;
- Remember your nation's history.

And God encourages such remembering, because God knows that human beings are prone to 'elective forgetting'. When this happens judgements are made, hurt prevails, and divisions occur.

Let me explain:

- Do we want to go back to the days of the old education system, where left-handed children were forced to write with their right hand, because it was deemed to be the right thing?
- Do we want to go back to teachers using the cane or strap if you misspelt more than three words?
- Do we want to go back to the days when there was denial of opportunity for late development?

All of the above happened to me and to my friends.

Educational assessments, at whatever age, do not assess all of what makes us unique and special. They cannot assess how many times you have been a caring friend; they cannot assess how many times you bring a smile to a person's

face; they cannot assess your commitment to helping someone in need.

*'Educating the mind without educating the heart  
is not education at all.'* (Aristotle)

It seems to me that is why God came to dwell with us, to show us how to educate the heart, to recognise the excluded, to reach out to the unloved, and to speak about the Love of God.

I want to live and be part of a world that embraces uniqueness, that brings opportunity to those in need, that welcomes those who want to move mountains because they feel passionately about injustice, that encourages growth whatever the age, whether we have little hands or silver grey hair.

Why?

The Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed, it is faithfully planted and it is cared for by God.

Has your old seed bed gone dry?

If so, allow God to plant new seeds.

Thanks be to God.

## PRAYER FOR THE MONTH



About this time of year people of the Jewish faith mark the feast of 'Rosh Hashanah'. The words in Hebrew mean 'beginning of the year'.

On the feast of Rosh Hashanah people celebrate God's creation. During a festive meal pieces of apple dipped in honey are eaten. It is an expression of hope for a sweet and pleasant year ahead. The

Jewish New Year is celebrated on the first and second days of the Jewish month of Tishri (which falls in September or October).

Rosh Hashanah is also the first day of a ten-day period of reflection, asking God's forgiveness for faults of the past and promising to approach things in a better way in the year ahead.

On the 21st September a ram's horn, called the 'shofar', is blown. Genesis chapter 22 details the episode of Abraham and Isaac and the sacrifice of a ram. The blowing of the shofar, the ram's horn, recalls this incident.

## PALANI MISSION UPDATE

Our journey with the Revd John Abraham and the Palani Mission started in May 2016, when we were introduced to his church and congregation in Tamil Nadu. Among the members of his church were two young women who had finished their formal education and were seeking employment. They had been selected for training as midwives but were unable to fund their two-year academic course. Where they live poverty is wide spread and the infant morbidity rate is high: one in three babies do not survive childbirth.

Our gift of sponsorship, £500 each to Sandiya and Vanilla, to cover their first year of study, helped the girls' immediate needs; their future employment as midwives will also bring prosperity to their families and put money back into the community. On 26th September 2016 they started their training, and have now completed the first year by successfully passing their examinations. We have now sent another £1,000, and that will enable the girls to continue their course, which restarted on 22nd September this year.

A third practical year will complete their qualification in the summer of 2019.

Additional encouraging news from Revd John relates to Palani Mission's attempt to found a new church in Pulliyampatti. For us as a church trying to discern how we can develop the partnership, this project provides a wide range of new possibilities. It is therefore appropriate that our minister, Ruth, along with Bee and Gordon Griffiths, has decided to visit the Mission, the girls and the region next summer, and can fact-find on our behalf and report back.



### A Favourite Prayer

Many people now find their mobile phones indispensable, appreciating the opportunity to stay 'connected' and 'in touch' wherever they find themselves. Pearl and Bill Thomas have sent the following piece from their church notices, which reminds us that prayer serves a similar purpose in keeping us close to God.



"The first ever cordless phone was created by God.

However for many of us prayer does not always come easily, and for those times when it is difficult to find the 'right' words, Eric Perry recommends dwelling on the opening words of a familiar prayer from the *Alternative Service Book* of the Church of England:

"Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden...."

This reminds us that God already knows our deepest thoughts and desires, even when we can't express them. Eric writes, "What truth there is in these words... In my view this makes an excellent start to any prayer!"

Whether or not we can find the words to continue, the important thing is that we are staying 'in touch'.
