The Grace

The Water of Life

[a cup/chalice of water in the centre of the table]

Jesus says, "Everyone who drinks will be thirsty again, but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life!" Lord, give us this water, so that we may never be thirsty again!

Jesus says, "Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty."

Lord, we have given up everything to follow you.

Jesus says, "If you wish to follow me, you must deny yourselves, and take up your cross, and follow me. For whoever seeks to save their life will lose it and whoever loses their lives for my sake and for the gospel will find it." **Lord, I believe; help thou mine unbelief!**



Jesus asks, "Do you wish to leave me?"

Lord, to whom should we go? For you have the words of eternal life.

We have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.
